Increasing domestic funding for a sustained response



## Purpose

To enhance the capacity, output, or impact of existing HIV and AIDS programmes in Member States. The SADC Secretariat coordinates the operationalisation of the Fund.

## Achievements

Enhanced capacity to address HIV prevention and generated knowledge to inform the development of evidence-based policies and interventions:

- evidence on the psychosocial and sexual and reproductive health needs of adolescents aged 10 to 19 living with HIV to inform programming and policies
- knowledge on infant and young child feeding in the context of HIV among more than 12,000 mothers
